Fostering gives kids hope for a brighter future

OSTERING may not be something you have thought about before. Many people do not realise what precious skills they have which could help turn a child's life around and make a real difference.

In a recent interview with foster carers from Clifford House, we found out why they became foster parents. Q. What made you decide to become foster carers?

A. "We became foster carers because we had enough space in the house and we believed that we had raised our own children well. offering them a loving and stable home so it seemed like a natural thing to do, offering a loving and proper home to other children.

"I was 100 per cent sure we could give any child or young person these things - love and stability – regardless of their background. A good home, good food, love and attention, these things are essential and what I enjoy offering.' A. "In the Muslim

community it is a very good thing to give to others. It is good for God in my community to offer a place in my home and my heart

Q. What do you think makes a good foster carer?
A. "Patience and love,

consistency and care and having a big heart are things I think make a good foster carer. Being a strong person and knowing right and wrong are essential plus being honest and flexible "You have to be able to build

trusting relationships with the children and that takes time and patience sometimes

A. "Ultimately, fostering is a job but it's far more than that because the children become part of your family. 'I very much enjoy being a foster carer and although there have been some difficulties along the way, I find it rewarding and am happy with the choice my family, my husband and l have made."
